

Verbs - Present tense

A verb is the most important word in a sentence; without it, the sentence would not make sense. Verbs show an action, occurrence, or state of being (*exist*).

All sentences require both a verb and a subject (a noun or pronoun).

For example: A monkey climbed the tree.

Subject ↗

↖ Verb

Example Present tense : see
Perfect present tense: has seen

In the present simple, the base form of the verb is the same for every subject pronoun, except the third person, where you add an “s” to the end of the verb.
